Disability

Disability Law Project

Vermonters with disabilities can contact the Disability Law Project, Vermont's Protection & Advocacy agency, for assistance with civil legal matters related to their disability – regardless of income level. Legal matters can include: access to special education, health care, developmental services, assistive technology, and accessible transportation; disability-based discrimination in public accommodations, housing, and employment; children's SSI terminations based on disability; abuse, neglect, and exploitation; guardianships; issues related to being a victim of crime with a disability.
